### Regional Theory

**Prerequisites:** Centre Theory Pass and Centre Practical Award.

*Total possible 50 marks*

*Time allowed 1 hour*

**Section 1** Total 10 marks  
Questions based on Rule Book Sections I, IV, Appendix.  
*The questions are generally short-answer questions. These can include completion of a rule, multiple-choice or true/false questions.*

**Section 2** Total 10 marks  
Questions based on Rule Book Sections V and International Protocols (1,2,3,5)  
*These questions are generally short answer and are designed to test the candidate's knowledge of umpiring procedures*

**Section 3** Total 30 marks  
Questions based on Rule Book Sections II, III, IV  
*Questions require judgements to be made for on-court situations. Question format will vary from question to question so read the questions carefully. Some questions are worth 2 and some 3 marks*

## **New Zealand Theory**

**Prerequisites:** Pass in Regional Theory and a current Regional Practical Award.

**Total possible:** *60 marks*  
**Time** *1 hour 30 minutes*

**Section 1** Total 20 marks  
Questions based on Rule Book Sections I, IV V and Appendix  
*Questions are designed to test candidate's knowledge of game procedures.*  
*They are usually more difficult than those in the Part A examination.*

**Section 2** Total 10 marks  
Questions based on Rule Book Section V and all International Protocols  
*Question are designed to test the candidate's knowledge of umpiring procedures*

**Section 3** Total 30 marks  
Questions may be based on any part of the Rule Book  
*Questions are more challenging and candidates must include relevant explanations to gain full marks. Question format will vary.*
